

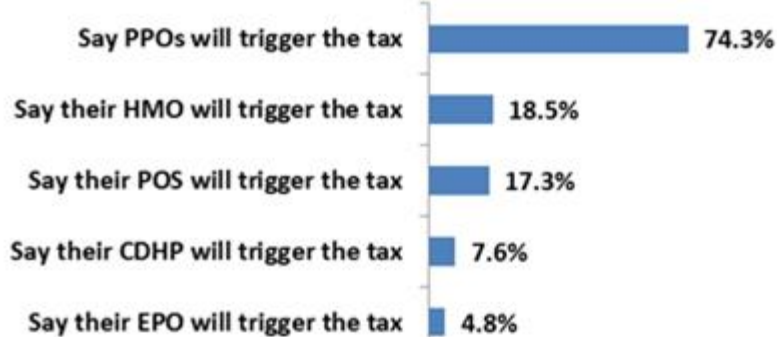

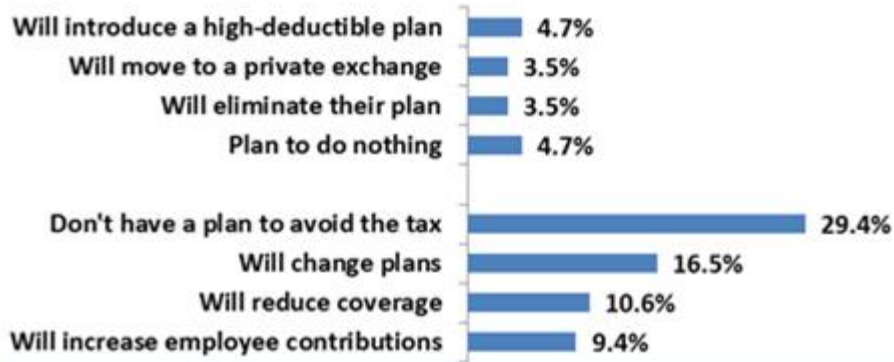
15% of plan sponsors expect at least one of their health plans to trigger the Cadillac tax
